2. In the scooter game we're playing in the gym, the red team scored 8 points. The blue team scored 7. How many points did the two teams have altogether?
3. On a beach near Halifax, Nelson went looking for seashells. He found nine and his little brother found 6 . How many seashells did the boys find altogether?

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
